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Academy for Career Exploration

The Academy for Career Exploration (ACE), Rhode Island's first public charter school, was founded in 1994 to serve Providence students, grades 9 through 12. ACE envisions a rapidly evolving global work environment in the 21st Century that will require constant learning to keep current with technology and the demands of the labor market. ACE's goal is to ensure that all students are career ready upon high school graduation and prepared to earn post-secondary credentials needed in their profession of choice. ACE consistently achieves attendance and graduation rates that exceed 93 percent and are among the best in the state. According to the Rhode Island School Accountability System, in 2014 ACE is classified as a "Leading" school and is the second highest rated high school in Providence, after Classical High School.

ACE partners with Providence-area employers to offer students access to professional work and uses hands-on education and small classes to engage students in applied learning. The course of study emphasizes math and literacy skills and the habits of mind necessary for lifelong learning. Teachers and counselors provide a steady, positive adult influence, and help students meet the school's standards for behavior, achievement, and attendance. Students must perform 100 hours of community service, academically eligible juniors and seniors hold after-school jobs arranged by ACE and all seniors complete a 90-hour internship or senior project that culminates in a Senior Exhibition before a community panel. ACE has three Career Pathways: Medical/Health, Business Management & Marketing and IT/Web Development and Programming. All 9th grade students will experience an exploratory course in all three Pathways, which will prepare them to enroll in one of the Pathways at the beginning of the 10th grade. Students use their experiences throughout the 10th, 11th and 12th grades in their chosen Pathway to develop the skills, knowledge, and professional relationships needed to find success in these broad industries. ACE's unique approach to graduation produces young adults who think critically and can succeed in the professional world.

Beacon Charter High School for the Arts



Beacon Charter High School for the Arts develops artistic thinkers by nurturing self-expression while preparing graduates with academic skills necessary for sustained postsecondary success.

Academically, Beacon outperforms the state average in all areas of the NECAP assessment. In 2012-2013, Beacon had the highest writing score and one of the highest reading scores in the state. Culturally, Beacon offers a warm, supportive environment that allows students to thrive while they pursue their creative passions. Every student at Beacon chooses an area of focus – culinary arts, performing arts or visual arts. Gallery nights, film festivals, plays, special dinners and luncheons provide opportunities for students to exhibit their knowledge and hone their artistic skills in practical settings connected to the real world. Beacon graduates young student-artists who are prepared for post-secondary education, and equipped to tackle the rest of life's challenges.

Blackstone Academy Charter School



Blackstone Academy is a high school for students from Pawtucket and Central Falls (adding Providence in 2015-2016) who are seeking a college preparatory curriculum in an intimate instructional setting.

The school's theme is "Community Involvement and Improvement" and students get involved in the local and global community throughout their high school years.

The school offers a highly personalized environment where every student is part of a 12 member advisory group and they meet with their advisors every day.

To graduate from Blackstone, students must take the core courses required by most four-year colleges and present three portfolios, a senior project and a senior research paper. All students are required to complete job shadows, internships and service learning projects. Graduates of Blackstone are prepared for both higher education and leadership roles. In addition to earning a high school diploma, students can earn a certificate in Non-Profit Studies. Blackstone Academy is one of four high schools in the state to earn a "Commended" status for three years in a row. The school is expanding over a three year period and will eventually have a student population of 350. About 85% of graduates go on to four year colleges and about 83% of students receive free/reduced price lunch annually.

The Compass School



The Compass School is a small learning community offering a curriculum emphasizing environmental sustainability and social responsibility.

The Compass School is organized into multi-age/multi-year classes that offer children a continuous educational experience. Students are paired with a teacher for two years. An integrated project-based curriculum provides the foundation to develop each individual as a cognitive, physical, social, emotional, and reflective being. The faculty and staff at The Compass School believe that learning is most effective when it takes place within an environment that provides a genuine, relevant context. Students graduate knowing they are members of a global community having developed an awareness of and practiced their personal, social and ecological responsibility.

The Greene School



The Greene School is a charter high school focused on a rigorous, college preparatory curriculum for students in Rhode Island. It focuses on developing a culture of personal community, and global stewardship. Using a curriculum centered on direct experiences with environmental science, and the technology that affects the natural world. Students at The Greene School develop and integrate their strengths as they explore their roles in local and global communities.

The school's culture and climate has an emphasis on an ethic of excellence, tolerance, and character development for moral and social responsibility. Through a partnership with the Rhode Island Audubon Society and collaboration with Expeditionary Learning, The Greene School has established a strong foundation for rigor, relevance and a strong learning community. The Greene School currently resides in West Greenwich in a temporary location with the expectation to build a "green" sustainable building in a central location on Rhode Island.

All students spend 50% of their instructional time in English and 50% in either Spanish or Portuguese.

ICS is one of only two dual language bilingual education schools in Rhode Island.

Kingston Hill Academy



Kingston Hill Academy (KHA) is an elementary school dedicated to providing students with the opportunity for an inclusive, individualized, and challenging curriculum that supports them to reach full potential.

KHA seeks to impart curriculum in a constructivist frame. That is, the students actively construct their understanding while interacting with the content, the teacher, and each other. The students are responsible for their learning. The staff is there to guide, to hold high expectations, to organize a series of relevant experiences and to present content and information. The staff models appropriately for students and provides multiple opportunities for students to practice new skills and demonstrate success. The average number of students is approximately 21 per classroom, and there is a full time teaching assistant in each classroom. Kingston Hill Academy has been recognized as a "Commended" school in both 2012 and 2013.

The Learning Community's academic program is based on national standards and the latest research-based instructional strategies. New England Laborers' / Cranston Public Schools Construction & Career Academy



The NEL/CPS Construction & Career Academy is an innovative collaboration between the Cranston Public Schools and the New England Laborers' trade union – the first of its kind nationally. The school provides students with a solid comprehensive academic foundation in an authentic learning environment that enables them to explore careers through two pathways: The Construction Craft pathway and the World of Work pathway.

The Academy offers comprehensive instruction in construction skills and knowledge, in a strong academic program that is aligned with the Common Core State Standards. Students have the opportunity to apply their skills in a safe, hands-on construction laboratory. Students can earn a high school diploma and enroll in a union apprenticeship at the New England Laborers' Training Academy. Upon successful completion, each apprentice is awarded credits at the Community College of RI and is eligible for employment as a trade laborer. The Academy also offers all students a World of Work Pathway, where students learn skills to prepare them for any career they may choose, and seniors have employment opportunities and earn credit for the experience. Most Academy students go on to colleges and universities. The Academy is proud to announce in 2014 they were granted a full five-year charter renewal!

Times² STEM Academy



At TAPA, students are taught utilizing an arts-integrated, Common Core Standards-based curriculum. Students are prepared to successfully meet or exceed state graduation requirements, and perform at or above grade level on all state and local assessments. The school day includes an extended schedule with block classes and a focused remediation/enrichment time. TAPA meets students' individual academic needs using assessment data and continuous feedback, while providing clear academic, social and artistic expectations. TAPA is a student-centered caring community that fosters leadership, intellect, self-confidence and responsibility.

Village Green Virtual Public Charter School



Village Green is the first full-time blended learning school in RI. Presently serving students in grades 9-10, a new grade 9 class will be added each year until grades 9-12 are included in the 2015/2016 school year. Village Green's educational model allows students to progress at their own pace in the 100% online curriculum. When there are skill gaps or roadblocks to mastering a subject, students attend workshops with other students having the same skill gap.

Village Green's goal is to utilize data collection to make the classroom experience highly relevant for every student. The school's curriculum contains courses aligned to the Common Core State Standards from grade 6 to Honors and Advanced Placement. The school also offer courses in technology such as web-design, flash game animation, and basic programming. Village Green is not a replacement for school as some virtual schools are; however, their on-line curriculum makes flexibility possible depending on student need. The major diagnostic curriculum and student information system partners are Northwest Evaluation Associates, Edgenuity, and Genius Systems Corporation. There are fourteen faculty, administration, and staff of which twelve are state certified.
