

Rhode Island Charter Schools Increase Student Applications for Federal Student Aid

8 of the 15 high schools meeting the 70% completion goal are charters

JULY 27, 2022 – PROVIDENCE – The Rhode Island League of Charter Schools today announced that eight charter schools met the state’s completion goal of 70% participation for the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA form determines a student’s eligibility for financial aid for college or graduate school.

“I am extremely proud of our charter schools for working with students and families to ensure that they successfully apply for financial aid,” said Keith Oliveira, Executive Director of the League of Charter Schools. “Our schools are also assisting students and families with college applications and the selection process as many are the first in their family to attend college. This is just one example of Rhode Island charter schools supporting families beyond the school day.”

Rhode Island set a goal to raise the percentage of students who complete the FAFSA starting with the 2019-20 school year. Rhode Island ranked eighth in the country in 2018-19 with a 65% completion rate among high school seniors.

The following charter schools achieved the 70% completion goal:
